Profile

Our school was established as the Third Secondary School in 1900 (Meiji the 33rd). Later, in 1948 (Showa the 23rd), it merged with Tsushima Girls’ High School, which had been established in 1915 (Taisho the 4th). As a result, our Tsushima High School was newly opened. In 2020, our school is to celebrate its 120th Anniversary.

Thus, its roots go back to about 120 years ago. It has produced many great talents in a broad range of fields. Also, our educational environment has been improved in earthquake resistance and air-conditioning in recent years. Besides, in the southwest of our school, we have been presented with a Special Study Hall named “Kougakukan,” by our Alumni Association. The New Hall is connected with our predecessors’ Old Auditorium. The area is the **splendid spot** where Tradition and Innovation **meet**.

Our Tsushima High has two schools, full-time and part-time. The full-time school has a regular course and an international understanding course. The latter course began in 2007(Heisei the 19th).

Our School Motto is, as mentioned above, “Knowledge, Humanity, and Courage.” With rich greenery and vast school land area, we keep a good tradition of the values under which this school was originally founded.

We have 33 classes from Monday to Friday, with 6 or 7 periods of 50 minutes each. And we have supplementary classes before and after ordinary classes. Moreover, in long-term vacations or on Saturdays, special study programs are organized. At the same time, we put a lot of energy into club activities and school events. Our school is the **superb stage** where Pen and Sword **meet**.

In this way, we encourage our students to make a well-balanced improvement of mind and body. We also encourage our students to build up a good personality through a diverse range of extracurricular activities. We expect our students to foster their spirits of independence and self-reliance and participate in school events eagerly. Most importantly, Tsushima High is the **significant School** where Students and Teachers **meet** the expectations of the parents and citizens.

Tsushima-jinja Shrine

Tsushima Shrine has about 1470 years of history. It is believed to have the power to avoid plagues and repel evil. It is one of the most famous spiritual sites in Japan. Many traditional Japanese architectural designs can be found here, like the Romon(tower gate) donated by Hideyoshi in 1592. Also, it is the head shrine of all Tennnoh shrines. It is worth paying a visit.



Festivals



Owari Tsushima Tennoh Festival, counted among Japan's top three river festivals, is said to be the most beautiful of Japan's many summer festivals. It boasts nearly 600 years of tradition as the festival of Tsushima-jinja Shrine, and records say that Oda Nobunaga attended it. The Danjiri float of the Festival has been designated a national Important Intangible Folk Cultural Property, and it was registered on the UNESCO Intangible Cultural Heritage List as one of the "Yama, Hoko, Yatai, float festivals in Japan" on Dec.1, 2016. The Evening Festival is held on the fourth Saturday of July, and the Morning Festival is held on the following morning. You can enjoy other festivals as well all year round.

Nostalgic Landscapes & Temples



The area around Honmachi-suji Street is full of historical sights, where the appearance hasn't changed since the Muromachi Period, and a jumbled thicket of narrow lanes remains. There are some remains of lattice doors, rooftop shrines, storehouses, and merchants' houses, preserving evidence to the modern day of the city's development as a port town and commercial city. Temples proliferated as the town grew, and there are close to ninety temples within the city.
